What is NET cancer?

NETs include a group of rare tumors that develop in the endocrine system. They can be slow growing and are often underdiagnosed. If left untreated, these tumors can result in serious illness and death.

NETs are found most commonly in the lung and gastrointestinal system, but they can occur in other parts of the body such as the pancreas, ovaries, and testes.

Why NET Cancer Day?

NET Cancer Day is an international awareness-raising event held each year on November 10 and sponsored by the International Neuroendocrine Cancer Alliance (INCA). Because most NETs are misdiagnosed or not discovered until an advanced stage, spreading the word about the importance of early diagnosis and treatment is critical to improving outcomes.

INCA advocates for patients by seeking to make NET an international public health priority. Through activities, educational forums, and information sharing, our global community puts the focus on NET cancer for healthcare providers, government agencies, pharmaceutical companies, patients, and caregivers.
